ISIASIA COACH ACCREDITATION PROGRAM

We are pleased to announce that ISIAsia will introduce a new ISIASIA COACH ACCREDITATION PROGRAM for our Professional Members. The program will be launched this August during Skate Asia. As you can see from the leaflet, this program will be divided to five levels, from Basic Skills coach Level to Pro Rated Coach Level which need to be passed in order.

This program will only be available during Skate Asia each year. This year we will kick start the Level 1 and free of charge for those who submit application before the deadline of Skate Asia which is 7 June 2017. USD50 will be charged if application after the deadline. A certificate will be issued upon completion of the program.



- LEVEL 1 - BASIC SKILLS COACH (5.5 hours – 4.5 hours On-ice training & 1 hour seminar)
- Ideally suited to coaches working with new skaters.
- The course takes coaches through the technical aspect of coaching from Pre-Alpha to Delta Level.
- Understanding the ethics involved in coaching and developing of the sport in Asia
- Identifying the roles and responsibilities of a basic skills coach
- 1 hour seminar Off-ice with ISI US Referee & ISIAsia Board of Directors
 4 hours training On-ice with professional guest coach Kori Ade

Tips to remember when filling in the Competition Entry Forms:

We encourage skater and parents to read the ISIAsia website (www.isiasia.org) and the magazine publications to understand what to expect from the competition.

Taking part in multiple events is that they offer competitions in all disciplines of ice skating. Taking parts in multi events gives a skater the opportunity to try out various different aspects of skating, they will gain the valuable experience of becoming more relaxed when competing in fornt of the judges and will feel much more involved with the whole event.

Not every event will need a new program and expensive costume. When deciding which events to enter consider the skaters personality, and make sure they have a challenging balance of technical, creative and fun events.

Find a friend for Jump & Spin, Couples or Spotlight Couples, great fun for best friends on a trip.

We encourage coaches attending a competition to try to get their skaters organized into a team of some kind. For most kids the team event is the highlight of the competition, it builds team working skills (for parents too) and let's them fully experience the atmosphere of excitement at the rink. It may be a lot of work, but is really rewarding and Fun for the coach too!

If you don't have enough students liaise with another coach to form a team surprise, synchro team, ensemble or small production.

Re-use or adapt existing programs, if a skater is daunted by learning lots of new choreography.

Start planning your training time, to allow for extra lessons and practice time before the competition, in order to attain that winning performance.

More events will earn more team points, and more chances of winning a medal with a blue ribbon.

For the Championship Series all events entered on the entry form give the skater, and coach who also attends the judges meeting, a chance to earn Championship Series Points.





In 2016, five competitions from different countries held in different months have been chosen to join the <u>First Championship Series</u>, including <u>Skate Beijing</u>, <u>Skate Asia</u>, <u>Skate Bandung</u>, <u>Skate Hong Kong and Skate Bangkok</u>. <u>Skaters</u>, <u>Coaches and Ice rinks gain points from joining these selected competitions</u>. The top ten skaters, top three coaches and the Champion rinks will be awarded.

TED WILSON TROPHY

In 1999, Mr. Ted Wilson founded the Ice Skating Institute Asia (ISIAsia).

Mr. Wilson played a very important role in promoting the ISI Recreational Skating Program across Asia and in recognition of all his efforts, we have created the "Ted Wilson Trophy" in his memory.

The initial concept of the design of the Ted Wilson Trophy was suggested by



Executive Committee (EC) after various discussions amongst the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee. Mr. Wilson had designed a striking emblem when hosting the first Skate Asia, using a silhouette of a Chinese dragon over a skate blade, so we wanted to recreate this dragon image for our memorial trophy. He had also presented a 'Lalique Trophy' for freestyle 10 competitors when skate Asia was hosted in Hong Kong in 2001, so it seemed fitting, when we finally found this beautiful Lalique dragon.

The 'skating dragon' was then skilfully mounted onto a freestyle blade and set on an oval crystal base to create this elegant trophy.

The Ted Wilson Trophy will be a travelling trophy for our Skate Asia Event.



The first Skate Asia event was started by Mr. Ted Wilson in 1989 and this year in Indonesia is the 17th Skate Asia. Thereafter, Ted Wilson Trophy will be travelling around the Asian Countries wherever the Skate Asia takes place.

2016 ISI TEST & COMPETITION RULE REVISIONS

These 2016 Test & Competition Revisions are mandatory for <u>all testing and competition events beginning 9/1/16</u>.

1. TEST REVISIONS & CLARIFICATIONS

- Freestyle 2 Remove ½ Toe Walley requirement.
- Freestyle 2 Add new Jump Sequence: Waltz jump / Tap-toe jump / 3-turn or Mohawk turn / One-Half Flip jump. Skater must perform these 3 jumps in sequence. No additional turns or steps are permitted.
- Freestyle 2 Ballet jump Both legs should remain straight in the air position.
- Freestyle 5 Dance step sequence RFI twizzle (Step #6) is now 1½ rotations.
- Freestyle 6 Spin Combination with 3 Positions and Change of Foot A combination spin must be performed with a minimum of any 3 spin positions from these options: Sit spin, Back Sit spin, Camel spin, Back Camel spin, Layback spin. Each spin position must meet the minimum passing test standard as previously described in the ISI Handbook and must be held for a minimum of three revolutions each. This spin must also include one change of foot. Examples include: Camel / Sit / Back Sit or Camel / Back Camel / Back Sit or Layback / Sit / Back Sit.
- **Spin Variations** Skaters are allowed to add variations to any required spin position, but the variation will not count as part of the spin requirement to meet the test standard (for testing and competition events) in traditional Freestyle, Solo Compulsory, Jump and Spin, Couples, and Pairs.
- Freestyle 9 Opposite spin For testing and in competition events, a Sit spin, Camel spin, or Layback spin must be performed in both directions. The two spins must be in succession with a minimum number of steps between each spin.
- Open Freestyle Platinum Two different additional double jump combinations with at least one double jump in each combination from Freestyle 8-10 levels.
- Pair 5-7 Dance Step Sequences During the compulsory part of the test, all required turns must be
 performed separately in unison (as described in the equivalent Freestyle test reference).
- Dance Step Patterns The Freestyle 5-8 patterns have been re-drawn to better illustrate correct edges and pattern placement.
- Video Test Guidelines See the ISI Handbook for details as some video guidelines have changed.

 Uncaptured Moves – For many years, there have been uncaptured move limitations (based on the skater's test level) for most ISI events.

An uncaptured move is any gliding maneuver, jump, or spin that is not a required maneuver on any test level.

The uncaptured moves limitations for gliding maneuvers, jumps, and spins have been removed for the following events: Artistic, Couples, Couples Spotlight, Freestyle, Interpretive, Open Freestyle, Open Pair, Pair, Rhythmic, Solo Spotlight, Themed Spotlight, Freestyle Synchro, and Team Compulsories.

There are no uncaptured maneuvers allowed in Solo Compulsory and Jump & Spin events. Only the selected maneuvers can be performed along with 3-turns, mohawks, crossovers, and arm movements.

<u>CAUTION</u>: When adding any additional move to any program, carefully check to make sure that move is not a required maneuver on a higher test level.

- Creative Figure / Free Figure events There is a maximum time limit of 1:30 minutes for all levels.
- **Team Compulsory maneuvers** When choreographing a Team Compulsory routine, make sure each skater performing their required maneuver is highlighted (somewhat away from other team members) so the skater and that maneuver can be more easily seen by the judges.

3. Judging Revisions & Clarifications

- a. <u>Solo Compulsory events judging criteria</u> The current "General Overall" criteria will be changed to "Penalty" on the Judge 1 (Referee) sheet only. Any penalty score of 2.0 for attempting illegal maneuvers will only be assessed by Judge 1 (Referee). <u>If no penalty is given, each skater will receive</u> 7.0 for this criteria or 8.0 if the skater is "against the book".
- b. **Solo Compulsory events** Only the first attempt at each maneuver will be scored. Any additional attempt will not be judged and there is no penalty given.

All 3 judges will give a score of "0" if the required maneuver is not attempted or if the wrong maneuver is performed.

c. <u>Dance and Synchronized Team events</u> – Judges can include current Associate Judges.
